Reflection Questions

1. What assumptions do we make about people or situations that may not reflect God's perspective? How does Jesus' response to the man born blind challenge us to look beyond blame?
2. What does the Sabbath teach us about balancing rest, devotion to God, and caring for others? Are there ways we can become more focused on rules than on loving God and people?
3. Jesus describes Himself as the Good Shepherd who knows His sheep and lays down His life for them. What does it mean personally to be known, protected, and cared for by Jesus?
4. Psalm 23 speaks of God's presence even in "the valley of the shadow of death." Where do you need to trust the Good Shepherd more deeply in your current season, and what might that trust look like in practice?
