Reflection Questions

- Reflecting on Judges 7, consider Gideon's initial army of 32,000 soldiers dwindling down to a mere 300. What does this drastic reduction reveal about God's intention to demonstrate His power through human weakness? How does this principle challenge our understanding of strength and reliance on our own abilities?
- 2. Consider the unconventional way that Gideon's 300 soldiers defeated the Midianites by using jars, torches, trumpets, and shouts. How does this account illustrate God's ability to work through seemingly weak and unconventional methods to achieve His purposes? Reflect on instances in your own life where God has used unexpected or humble means to demonstrate His power and glory.
- 3. How should a Christian's perspective of life's challenges be different from a non-believer's? When have you ever faced a challenge that seemed too big for you to handle? How can we draw encouragement from the Lord during difficult times in our lives?
