Reflection Questions

- Jesus' teaching on Marriage: 1.
 - Marriage is a divine institution. (Matthew 19:6 – "... God has joined together...")
 - b) It is meant to be **complementary**. (Matthew 19:4 – "... the Creator 'made them male and female' ...)
 - Marriage is intended to be **permanent**. c) (Matthew 19:5 – "... the two will become one flesh")
 - d) It is to be exclusive. (Matthew 19:5 "... united to his wife...")
 - e) The marriage bond would surpass that of a man's relationship with his parents.

(Matthew 19:5 – "... for this reason a man will leave his father and mother and be united to his wife ...")

What does Jesus' teaching on Marriage mean to you? What does it mean in your marriage? (if you are not married, what should it mean to a Christian marriage?)

God hates divorce, and He also hates the sins leading to 2. divorce, such as infidelity, abuse (physical or emotional), lack of love, lack of honour, lack of faithfulness, lack of responsibility.
