
## **Reflection Questions**

- 1. With regards to the Doctrine of Pre-destination and Election, reflect on your own salvation how much of it was the Holy Spirit's leading, and how much was your own choice? If you can, share with your group the Holy Spirit's work in bringing you to Christ.
- Romans 10:17 "Consequently, faith comes from hearing the message, and the message is heard through the word about Christ."
   Read also the Parable of the Sower in Matthew 13. Faith is needed for a person to trust in Jesus and faith comes from hearing God's Word. But the Parable of the Sower also teaches us that a person might not receive faith immediately after hearing the Message of God.

Do you agree that it is therefore important for a pre-believer to hear the Gospel and the Word of God as often as possible? If so, how do you think we can do that?

If you know the details of how a certain person came to Christ, share the circumstances leading to him/her making the decision. How many times did the person hear the Gospel and God's Word before that?

## SERMON REFLECTIONS

3. Romans 10:8-13 makes it so simple for anyone to be saved – can you share with each other how one can be saved?

Even though it is so simple for anyone to be given eternal salvation from sin and hell, and to become a child of God, why is it that:

- a) Not everyone has heard (even our own relatives and friends)
- b) Even for those who have heard, some would not believe

What are the problems causing (a) and (b)?
What are the potential solutions to overcome (a) and (b)?

4. Take time now to pray in 2s or 3s, for at least 4 of our family, friends, colleagues, etc who are pre-believers; that God may send Christians to share the gospel with them, that the Holy Spirit will take away the veil of the evil one covering their minds (2 Corinthians 3:14), and cause their heart to be good soil for the Word of God to grow.
