Reflection Questions

This sermon is about a judge, Jephthah, whose life story can teach us much about our own stories. In my sermon I asked many questions, which I hope we will answer, with the Holy Spirit helping us if we find any questions difficult to address.

We can start by reading Judges 11 and 12 as a group.

1. Are some Christians (we) still having some form of Baal worship – desiring wealth, power, sex WITHOUT obeying God's will in morality, righteousness and concerns for others?
2. How do we deal with life's difficult situations? (If you are willing, share a difficult situation which you or your loved one had encountered.)
3. Do we know our strengths? What do we do with them?
4. What are the consequences of not knowing God's Word?
5. Do we realise that what we do or say as parents (including god-parents, grand-parents and spiritual parents) have a serious consequence on our children's lives? For those with children, share how you believe you have impacted your children (positively, negatively or very little impact).
