Sermon Reflection Questions

- Read Daniel 10 aloud (perhaps two to three verses per DG member).
 - What truths speak to you from this chapter of Scripture? Take some time to share.
- 2. During Pastor Aaron's sermon on 23 March 2025, the congregation was encouraged to participate in spiritual disciplines during this Lent period, particularly fasting. If you had fasted (in whatever forms whether from food, or from coffee only), or you actively drew close to the Lord through some kinds of spiritual disciplines (some of you had gone for a silent retreat), share with your DG what you did and what you experienced.
- 3. Using your knowledge of the Bible, try to answer the question theologically "Why does God not answer my prayers sometimes?" Do you know of someone who prayed earnestly but his/her prayers were not answered? What can you say to this person in an encouraging way?
- 4. Have you prayed intensely for something important? How intense was it (how often did you pray?) and what was your spiritual experience?
