I realise that to many of you, Communion is a vital part of your faith and worship. John Wesley, our founder, would heartily agree with you. For him, Holy Communion need not be confined to a once a month event. He advocated taking Communion as often as possible. I believe his desire was for the people called Methodists to remember the deep and great sacrifice of our Lord Jesus Christ, and just as importantly, Jesus' triumphal victory over death through his resurrection.
