SERMON REFLECTIONS

Producing Fruit in Keeping With Our Repentance and Faith

Matthew 3 | 4 July 2021

Reflecting on our faith; ways to live out biblical truths we have learnt:

1. John the Baptist calls those who came to him to repent for the kingdom of heaven is near. Biblical repentance is to admit and turn away from one's sins, and go toward Christ to be forgiven. Giving up deliberate sins, and the desire to give up sins is a result of genuine Biblical repentance.

In Luke 3:1-18 (similar passage to Matthew 3), what did John exhort those who came to him to repent, and to act in faith instead, so as to produce spiritual fruit?

What could Christians today repent, and in what ways can we act in faith instead, so as to produce fruit in keeping with repentance and our faith in Christ?

2. Matthew 3:10 "The axe is already at the root of the trees, and every tree that does not produce good fruit will be cut down and thrown into the fire."

Romans 10:9 "If you declare with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord' and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved."

Are these 2 verses contradicting each other – the former says producing good fruit is necessary in order not to be thrown in the fire, while the latter verse clearly teaches that one is saved by one's belief in the heart
